## NOTES ON THE ACCOUNTS

(Expressed in Hong Kong dollars)

### 1. STATUS OF THE ASSOCIATION

The Association was incorporated in Hong Kong under the Companies Ordinance on 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 1998 as a company limited by guarantee. Pursuant to the memorandum of association, every member undertakes to contribute an amount not exceeding \$10 to the assets of the Association in the event of its being wound up.

### SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

## (a) Statement of compliance

These accounts have been prepared in accordance with Hong Kong Financial Reporting Standards(which also include all applicable Statements of Standard Accounting Practice and Interpretations) issued by the Hong Kong Institute of Certified Public Accountants, accounting principles generally accepted in Hong Kong and the requirements of the Hong Kong Companies Ordinance. A summary of the significant accounting policies adopted by the Association is set out below.

## (b) Basis of preparation of accounts

The measurement basis used in the preparation of the accounts is historical cost.

## (c) Revenue recognition

Donation and other income are recognised upon receipt.

#### INCOME

Income represents the donation received and surplus from activities organised during the year.

## 4. TAXATION

No provision has been made for Hong Kong profits tax as not less than half of the income was received from members of the Association which is exempted from profits tax under Section 24(1) of the Inland Revenue Ordinance.

## 5. COMMITTEE MEMBERS' EMOLUMENTS

No fees or other emoluments was paid to the committee members during this or preceding year.
